Things you will need to paint outdoors in order of importance:

1. Hat that won't blow away. I can't paint with out a spiffy baseball cap.
2. Easel and you will probably want a little tray table to set your supplies on as well. It can be a real pain to bend over for each new color. A folding chair can be ok as a little table. I suspect it will be windy so the next option might be better.
3. If you don't have an easel, a beach chair works pretty well, because you can set your stuff on the ground.
4. Bug spray.....I even have tick killer socks, but I will not paint anywhere that I am forced to stand in high grass.
5. Sun Screen
6. Layers of clothing for the changing temp
7. White or black clamp on umbrella - also a problem in the wind.

We will not be able to paint outside if the threat of rain is high, but there are porches!

## Supply List for Oils and/or Acrylic

This list was made off Blick's and Jerry's websites:
I am a little concerned about oils, because you could end up with a bunch of paintings that were too wet to get home.

The one time I did oils while on the road in England, I got a tube of Winsor \& Newton Griffin Alkyd Fast Drying Oil Paint, 200ml (6.75-oz) tube, Titanium White. I used it with my oils and they were pretty much dry the next day.

Sadly, it is really expensive. \$29 from Amazon. You can use it with the waterbased or regular oils.

## 1. Paper towels or Rags - rags or paper towels covered in solvent and oil paint can spontaneously combust so....

## 2. Paints

If you have oils already, just bring all your favorite stuff.
Oils: If you are new to oils I recommend the Winsor Newton Artisans Water Based Oils. These feel just like oil paints and clean up with water instead of solvents.

Acrylics bring what you like or if you are knew to Acyrlics, any small set is good for a start



I have started using Golden Open Acrylics.
They dry much slower and in fact I have been using my regular white acrylic with them, because they almost dry too slowly.

## 3. Brushes

Any old brushes will work, but I recommend round brushes either a size 4 and 8 or just a size 6 for a start. I usually only use a one or two brushes.


## 4. Water or Solvent

You will also need something with a lid to carry some water with you and yogurt container to pour water into for washing brushes.

For solvent for regular oils you will want two jars with screw on lids and I will show you a great way to save your thinner for cleaning brushes.

## 4. Palette

If you have your own palette that's fine, but if you don't then paper pallets are ok. For Acrylics I often use paper plates or a pie plate, but this could be better. For painting outside you can tape them to your wooden palette or a board.

You can keep your oils in the freezer if you have a palette that closes up like this one. This is also nice for painting outside.

## 5. Painting knife

For oils it is really fun to paint with a palette knife. I have also seen paintings in acrylic done with a knife. This is a painting knife and has a pointy tip. Not like the palette knife you use to clean your pallete. Something like this one.

## 7. You will need a board (not foam core) and tape if you are working on paper.

Canvas or canvas panels are also fine. Whatever your budget allows. The important thing is to do lots of paintings!
$11 \times 14$ or $9 \times 12$ are good sizes for landscape. I would plan on at least two surfaces per class and I would bring two surfaces to the first class.
8. Portfolio made of cardboard or a real portfolio to keep all your paper in.

## Supply list for Pastels

You need paper, soft charcoal, fixative and a drawing board. These are my recommendations.


It is nice to have some clips instead of the rubber band or you can use masking tape as long as you take it off right away.

[^0]There are a lot of choices with pastels. Some of those choices are based on money, but like all art supplies, you get what you pay for.

These are the less expensive pastels and they are pretty good. They have a lot of nice colors, but you cannot replace the colors when they are gone. They will go pretty fast, but should last you the 10 weeks. It is nice to have 72 colors.



I use Rembrandt pastels. You can buy individual sticks when you run out of your favorite color. These will last longer, but as you can see the are 3 times the price.

This set does not have as good of blues or purples as the Faber Castelli, but they are softer and richer colors. You could order a small box of blues and a small box of purple to go with the set.

I store my finished pastels and my blank paper in a pad of tracing paper. The paper I use is $9 \times 12$ and I have a pad that is $11 \times 14$. I use a clip to keep things from moving around.

I can probably do 20-30 small pastels in a week even with teaching. You don't want to run out of paper!

## Watercolor Paper

I prefer hot pressed paper, because it has less texture. You can also use grey or tan drawing paper. I like to work small. My biggest block is $6 \times 8$ and I often just use a half sheet.


I like this pad, but I also really like to work on white. I takes me about 2 hours to do a painting in gouache.

I like small round brushes, because I feel I can do anything with them.


The round brushes are a number 8 and 3. The flat says it is a 5 . If I am going to draw I use a pencil so I have a couple of them, an erasure and a sharpener in my kit.

You will also need a little clip board or piece of hardboard and a clip or two to hold your paper, a water bottle, (seawater will not work, it has to be fresh), a little cup to keep water in, a little spray bottle and a few paper towels.

I love this, because I can keep it all in a tiny backpack for anytime painting.
