Workshop Leaders *Movement Workshop: Burlesque with Joe Williams*

In this safe and fun workshop, we will look at some of the history of burlesque, cheesecake, and beefcake in stage, film, and TV, even radio, and catch up on some of the Neo-Burlesque movement of our era. The Neo-Burlesque is known for its work in diversity of all types, age, size, gender, disability, skin color, and cultural background, and for renouncing stereotypes and cultural appropriation. As far as practical burlesque and burlesque theory goes, we will set aside the explicit, and instead explore the powers of concealment and revelation, of decoration, of mystery and trans-formation, and above all, the power of being seen. None of those require removing a single article of clothing, but we might discover a lot of fun in the slow removal of a single glove.
